WHAT MAKES LILACIA PARK SO SPECIAL?

In 2019, Lilacia Park was named to the National Register of Historic Places for its significant contribution to horticultural history in the United States. The park's grounds once held the estate of Colonel William R. Plum and his wife Helen Maria Williams Plum. Plum and his wife curated a collection of lilacs from the U.S. and around the world before donating the land to Lombard in 1927. Today, the park is a globally-recognized horticultural showcase that features over 700 lilacs and 35,000 tulips annually, budding in April and blooming in early May. Many visitors frequent the park during Lilac Time, a festival that has been celebrated in Lombard since 1930. In addition to Lilac Time events and festivities, Lilacia Park boasts 427 different species of plants (excluding lilacs and annuals), 17 different species of evergreen trees and shrubs, 20 different including 11 native different ornamental grasses, 4 native ferns, 271 perennials, and 29 different trees. Lilacia Park offers a spectacle for visitors of all ages to *enjoy life*.
